CONDUCT OF MBBS PHASE-I AND PHASE-II FINAL PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATIONS (2021)

In 2021, still under the tenebrosity of the Covid-19 pandemic assault on humanity and the precariousness it brought in on our daily lives, academic fulfillment and growth was one of the hard-hit areas for students and educational institutions. With the need to observe SOPs of physical distancing, conducting a full-fledged face-to-face final professional examination which includes theory and clinical skills, was a challenge for any educational institution. Our faculty exam committee with Deanery's guidance was able to stand up to this great challenge, having delivered both the phase I and II examinations successfully, appreciated by our team of external examiners who hailed from the prestigious educational institutions from around Malaysia.



PRO-PART-B EXAM for year 2 MBBS students, was held from 2nd August 2021 to 8th August 2021. The exam included theory paper – Single Response Answer (SRA), Case Based Question (CBQ) and Practical – Objective Structured Physical Examination (OSPE) and Objective Structure Clinical Examination (OSCE).

The Year 5 MBBS Final Professional Examination was held from 2nd November 2021 to 12th November 2021. This exam included theory paper-SRA and Practical – d-OSCE and Modified Long Case (MLC). Modified long case with simulated patient as an assessment tool, was embraced for the first time in our School of Medicine, with constructive and positive feedback from external examiners, staff, and our students, in which conducting the exam in a traditional hospital set-up is exigent but impossible during this pandemic era.

The journey to achieve our objectives fairly and effectively as ONE TEAM with limited resources with good positive feedback in the execution of the final exams from the students and staff is a reflective testimony for the same.

I would like to personally thank Dr. Gomalata for her commitment in helping with health logistic arrangements for staff, students, and simulated patients and to make sure all are safe throughout the examination period and Mr. Mahendran (FAST) and his team, in

providing logistical support for student movement to their respective exam venues and furnish temporary sealed holding area for student belongings during examinations.

Finally, the exam committee would like to take this opportunity to thank the Deanery and MAHSA management for their advice and timely support towards achieving this task with triumph, and for the allegiance and enthusiasm shown by all the invigilators, examiners, and the support staff.

Faculty of Medicine, Bioscience and Nursing (FOMBN) of MAHSA University is at the summit of the University Research output in 2022 with **over 100 Research Articles published in Scopus/ISI indexed journals, Six Book Chapters and over Ten Research Patents**. FOMBN also celebrates **Seven Research Awards** achieved by the Faculty staffs in 2021. The Faculty possesses **17 ongoing Research Grants** with ratio of research fund per staff reaching RM 11,315. FOMBN believes in widening its horizon in research and building a global repute. With this aim, the Faculty has successfully established **28 MOA/MOUs** with national and international institutes.

FOMBN has conducted the **MAHSA International Medical Technology Conference (MiMED) 2021** with the aim to encourage research and innovative ideas in diverse areas from Medical, Nursing and Biosciences perspectives. The conference brought forth ideas and concepts aligning with the needs of the society and demands from the industry in the wake of the fourth industrial revolution IR4.0 and sustainable development goals (SDGs) and strategies.

FOMBN is striving further to enhance the Faculty research culture and in turn the Faculty research output. With this aim, the Faculty has conducted several Research Clinics on various topics, ranging from guidance on Research Proposal writing, drafting different types of research articles, choosing appropriate journals and so on, thereby facilitating the Faculty staff to gain the required knowledge and skills so that they can utilize in their own research. The Faculty proudly recognizes the key Researchers for their great insights, contributions and persistence.

FOMBN proudly congratulates **Associate Professor Dr. Pallav Sengupta** for emerging yet again for the second consecutive year on the list of the **Top 2% Scientist in the world by the Stanford University, USA**. AP Dr. Pallav Sengupta has also won the **'Highest Publications Award'** from MAHSA University again this year in a row, for his thirty-one (31) publications in the year 2020. Moreover, this year, one of his published articles entitled 'SARS-Cov-2 and male infertility: Possible Multifaceted Pathology' in Reproductive Sciences has been awarded the **'Most Popular Review 2020: Clinical Sciences'** by the Springer Nature. He also ranks **Second among Infertility Research Experts (also in the sub-specialty of Male Infertility) in Malaysia in 2020 and 2021**, by the ExpertScape, with his total number of Research publications exceeding one hundred and eighty (180) with over 7500 citations and h-index of 37.

Dr. Antony Samrot, Research Manager, has won the **'Best Researcher Award'** from MAHSA University this year with his significant contribution in Faculty research. He has achieved 'Innovation Patent'. He has won **1st place in the Poster presentation in the National Level Technical Symposium Pansophy – 2021** conducted by the Department of Chemical Engineering, Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering on 15th May, 2021. He has also received **'Best Paper Award'** for his paper entitled **"Removal of Chromium Using Spions Impregnated with Activated Carbon"** in the International Conference On "Green Materials and Renewable Energy" organized by the Department of Applied Chemistry in association with the Department of Chemical Engineering, Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering, Sriperumbudur, Chennai, India.

Associate Professor Dr. Vetrivelan Subramaniyan is currently working as Deputy Dean (Undergraduate) and Associate Professor at the Faculty of Medicine, Bioscience, and Nursing, MAHSA University. Dr. Vetrisevan has obtained **Four Research Patents in Australia and South Africa**. Apart from that, Dr. Vetrivelan has published more than twenty papers and one book chapter in 2020-2021. He has also received an internal grant in 2021 from MAHSA University.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Vetrivelvan Subramaniyan is currently serving as Undergraduate Deputy Dean at the Faculty of Medicine, Bioscience, and Nursing. He is also the coordinator for postgraduate program Ph.D. (by Research). He has more than thirteen years of academic and research experience having worked in a few universities. He has worked in Arba Minch University (under the United Nations Development Program), Ethiopia, La-Trobe University Australia, and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, India. He has filed research patents in Australia, South Africa, and Germany and published more than thirty papers with a cumulative impact factor of around 100 in 2021. Also received an internal grant in 2021 from MAHSA University titled "Evaluation of Curcumin Against Excessive Consumption of Ethanol Induced Hepatotoxicity by Suppressing Oxidative Stress, modulating TLR4/NF- κ B p65 and CYP2E1/ROS/Nrf2 signaling pathway". His research interest includes synthetic and phyto-based drug development and pharmacological screening (in silico, in-vitro, and in-vivo).

He has been invited as an external examiner of AIMST University, UCSI University, UniKL University, and Geomatica University College Malaysia. He has reviewed more than 70 research papers in international and national peer-reviewed journals. As an active committee member in the Indian Pharmacological Society (IPS), Indian Pharmacy Council (IPC), Association of Pharmacy Professionals (APP), Associate Fellow of Malaysian Scientific Association (AFMSA), Indian Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (IACP), Malaysian Society of Pharmacology and Physiology (MSPP) and Fellow of Einstein Research Academy (FERA). Currently, he has been appointed as the Overseas-Executive member of the Indian Pharmacological Society.

Furthermore, Dr. Vetrivelvan actively participating as a reviewer of peer-reviewed journals such as Clinical Pharmacology: Advances and Applications, Journal of Multidisciplinary Healthcare, International Journal of Peptide Research and Therapeutics, Toxicology Reports, Open Access Macedonian Journal of Medical Sciences International, Journal of General Medicine, Journal of Experimental Pharmacology and World Journal of Gastroenterology.

Dr. Meram Azzani is a Public Health specialist and heads the Basic Science School, Faculty of Medicine, Bioscience and Nursing, MAHSA University.

Dr Meram was medically trained in Yemen and served in the Ministry of Health Yemen from 2004 to 2009. The clinical experiences from her early medical career helped her realize that treating one patient at a time was not sufficient and more could be done by intervening at a population level. She improved her basic epidemiology and biostatistics knowledge by completing the MPH



and Ph.D. with an Excellence award from the University of Malaya. She joined the MAHSA University in 2018 with the idea that intervening at the graduate level would improve the research skills of the medical and public health community.

Dr Meram research focuses on the burden, epidemiology and prevention of non-communicable diseases. Recently, she received an internal grant in 2021 from MAHSA University which focuses on “Cardiovascular disease risk prediction among university students amid Covid-19 pandemic using digital health tool (VITA App)”.

Dr Meram actively lectures in the fields of epidemiology, biostatistics, and research methods. She has supervised numerous Master candidates to completion. She actively supervises 3 doctoral students. She has provided numerous methodological and biostatistical consultations to graduate students and clinical researchers.

She is a scientific member and a reviewer in a number of international conferences and peer review journals. Dr Meram has published around 20 research papers, and has an h-index of 7 with 200+ citations.



Dr Shalini Vellasamy is currently the Head of Unit for Department of Microbiology and Parasitology, School of Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, Bioscience and Nursing, MAHSA University.

Dr Shalini obtained her PhD in Immunobiology from the Department of Pathology, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) in 2011. Following that she served as Post-Doctoral Fellow at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, UPM for 2 years. She then joined the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya as a Senior Lecturer before joining MAHSA University.

Dr Shalini’s research focuses on the immunology, microbiology and human stem cells. She has secured a few research grants previously that include both internal and external grants. Currently, she is the Principal Investigator for an FRGS research grant entitled “Immunomodulatory Effects of Crude Fenugreek Seed Extract on Uropathogen Infected Human Mesangial Cell Lines”. She has also secured an internal MAHSA Research grant last year 2021 and the project focuses on the “Effect of fenugreek seed extract on urinary tract infection in mice”. Currently Dr Shalini is supervising two postgraduate Masters students under the respective grants. She has gained valuable experience leading undergraduate and postgraduate students in academic and research projects. She has published over 20 research papers in Scopus and ISI indexed journals and has an h-index of 10 with 526 citations till present. She has presented research papers (oral and poster) at both international and local conferences and seminars.

MAHSA UNIVERSITY 19TH CONVOCATION – CLASS OF 2021

MAHSA University's 19th Convocation was successfully held on the 4th & 5th December 2021 at THE BALLROOM, MAHSA UNIVERSITY. The ceremony was conferred by the Chancellor, Yang Amat Berbahagia Tun Dato' Seri Zaki Bin Tun Azmi. The Faculty of Medicine, Bioscience & Nursing proudly graduated 458 students during the session. The ceremony was successfully concluded on the 5th December 2021 and sending off happy graduates back home with a lot of possibilities and great future ahead.



WORLD DIABETES DAY 2021

In conjunction with the World Diabetes Day 2021 (WDD2021), MAHSA Medical Society (MedSoc) has successfully collaborated with an NGO My Heart Organization, MyFundsAction, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, and Asian Medical Students Association [AMSA] MAHSA. Although World Diabetes Day is celebrated on the 14th November 2021, we have collectively decided to run an awareness program for the entirety of the month of November covering a wide range of events from informative webinars to a charity virtual run to promote healthy lifestyle changes, whilst setting up a donation site to provide the necessary diabetic kits distributed by MyHeart organization for those in need. Our students from the MAHSA Medical Society took the initiative to lead the main webinar series. The main title of the webinar series was called "Diabetes Mellitus: Don't Sugar Coat It" with 4 sub webinars based on the introduction to diabetes mellitus, the essentials of diabetic foot care, the relevance of gestational diabetes and finally addressing the modern issue of COVID-19 that could lead to diabetes mellitus. These virtual webinars were entitled "Who's Mr. Diabetes" (Webinar 1), "Foot Check" (Webinar 2), "Let Mom Dia-Beat this" (Webinar 3), and "COVID-19 leading to diabetes?" (Webinar 4). Since this was an enormous project, we resorted to both internally and externally recruiting people to include those from the medical faculty of MAHSA University, AMSA MAHSA and UKM. In total, our webinar team alone consisted of 46 students and they were allocated into their respective subgroups. Moreover, the management of MAHSA University was also generous enough to contribute to the cause by allocating the necessary funds to the MAHSA Medical Society to strengthen their support for this awareness program.

The efforts that we put into this event were not in vain as it was successfully published in a Chinese media outlet called Sin Chew Daily and there were many positive feedbacks from the audience. We also managed to augment our audience size with a separate Instagram account called @worlddiabetesday.2021, having a total reach of 12,268 people from 18th September to 16th December 2021. It has benefited our students in terms of confidence to hold and organize such projects with collaborative parties. Although the series has ended, we hope to implement this further in future activities that can shape our advocacy for other chronic diseases like hypertension being the silent killer. Furthermore, we hope our efforts shed some light on the seriousness of keeping diabetes under control to the general public.

The WDD2021 team humbly thank firstly MAHSA University, MyHeart Organisation, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, and Asian Medical Students Association MAHSA for helping us in making this project a monumental success. In addition to this, we would like to give special thanks to our honourable Dean, Prof. Dr Rusli Nordin and to our advisor, Dr Ardita Dewi for encouraging us with this project with their utmost support. We would not have done it without their major contributions to our project. Special mention to our honourable project head and fellow MAHSA Alumni, Dr Atiqah, for presenting us with this opportunity to give back to the community. 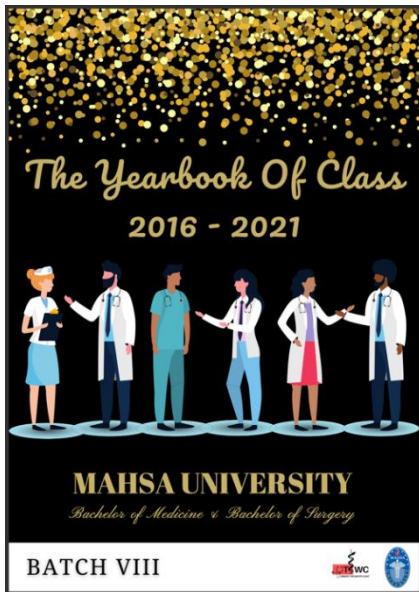

The planning for the Yearbook began in June 2021 right before the completion of the 8th Issue of Under The White Coat Magazine.

The Yearbooks were made on a preorder basis and distributed on Convocation Day.

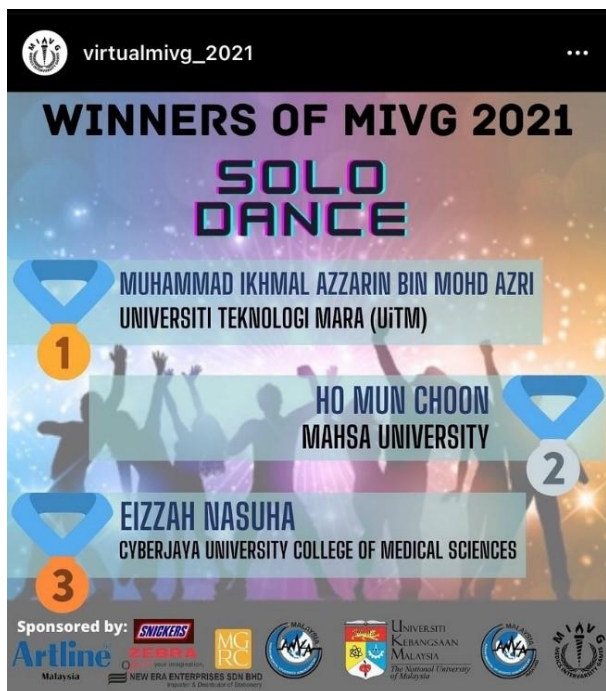


Virtual Medics Intervarsity Games 2021

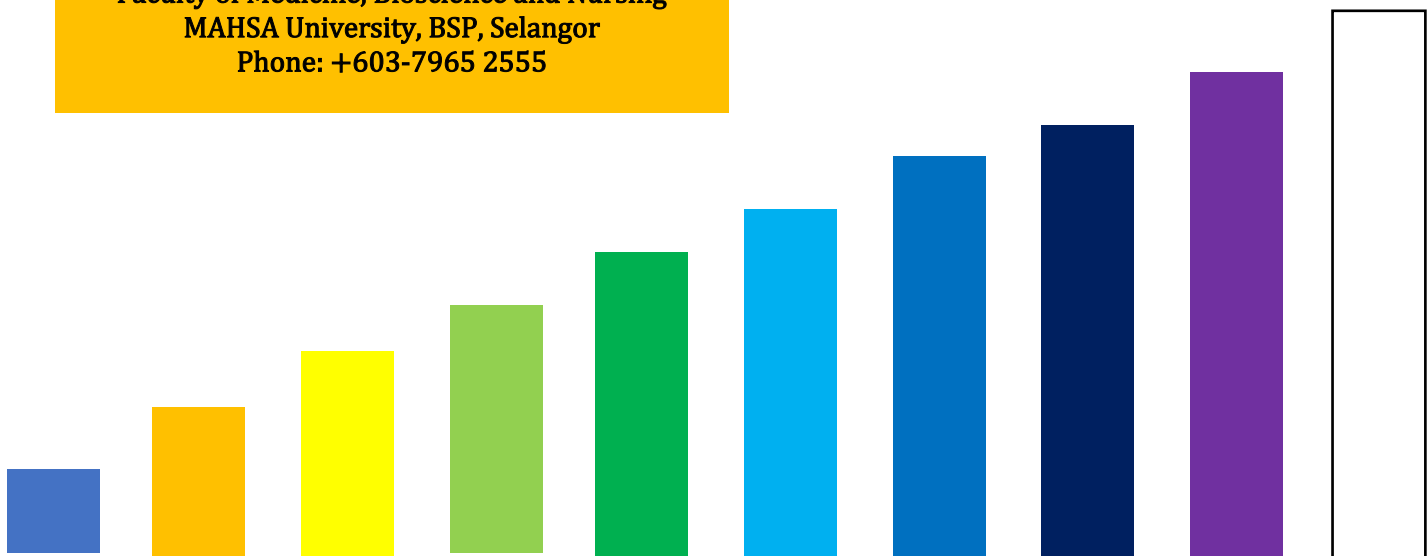
